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Because He Loved Us First

“Oh, No, the internet is not working again!” “Teacher, it’s raining cats and dogs, so I can’t come to class!” “Teacher, It’s too early in the morning. I can’t get up....”

The teacher in the first year of high school said, “Only four students came to class, and they all arrived late.” Two of the students in the third class of the middle school said, “We are too tired!” Another ten students didn’t show up, and they didn’t ask for a leave of absence. After waiting half an hour, the teacher contacted the students through social media. One of the students defiantly replied, “Teacher, we have asked for a leave of absence! ‘We’ represent all of us!” When they were in a good mood, the students would come to class; otherwise, none would show up. On exam papers and homework assignments, they copy one another! If a wrong answer is found in one student’s exam or assignment, the same wrong answer can be found in all the students’ exams and assignments.

In the face of such troublemakers, any teacher would become disheartened, let alone our teachers, who are all non-salaried volunteers. It is because of Jesus Christ’s love that they are willing to offer time, love, and life to teach a group of poverty-stricken children, to affect their lives with Jesus Christ’s aroma, and to help them ensure a promising future.

What’s the use of studying?

To be sure, because Myanmar is poor, many children must quit before finishing middle school so that they can earn money by doing labor work. Quite a few short-sighted parents think they would be satisfied if their children could start earning money at a young age to support their family. These parents do not subscribe to the idea that studying hard is the way to success because they are the old timers who have never studied.

In northern Myanmar, most girls are married off to raise a family as soon as they finish middle school. They are still just children. What is life? What is love? They are entirely ignorant of these questions. Once, through the internet, I asked a girl whether she would like to study. She sighed and said, “No.” She already has two young children to raise. Having to worry about the necessities

of fuel, rice, cooking oil, and salt makes it a moot point to think about her future.

To dispel the erroneous idea that “studying is useless,” the Go and Love Foundation launched virtual teaching-learning a little over two years ago in cooperation with the Holy Light Christian School to encourage young children to study further. In addition, the foundation suggested to the Holy Light Christian School to reinstate its high school, which had not been in operation for five years. Although there are only six students in the freshman class, the volunteer teacher still devotedly teaches them. As I recall, the teacher used the testimony of Dr. Hwang Meil-lian to encourage the students to work hard. Dr.

where can the children of Myanmar invest their hope?

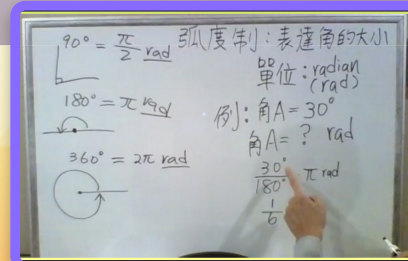
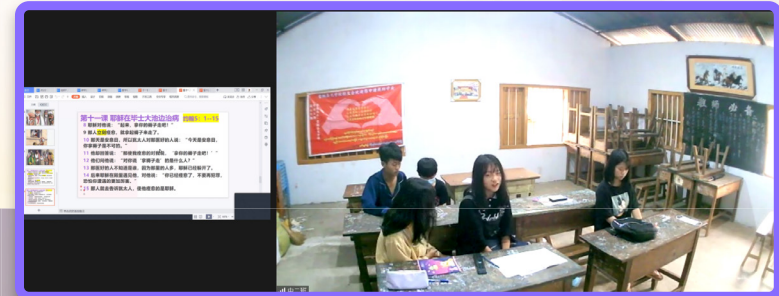
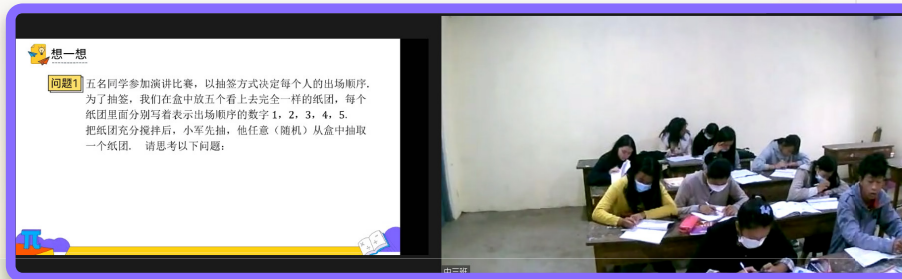
Hwang is the daughter of a pastor. At her birth, the doctor’s negligence led to her cerebral paralysis. She couldn’t speak, and her face was deformed. In this condition, she became, in her childhood, the target of taunting and laughter. But she was fearless. By God’s grace, she overcame all kinds of difficulties and courageously stood up. In the end, she even earned a doctoral degree in art from the University of California. Her fantastic testimony stimulated the children’s reflections: as healthy, normal human beings, they should take advantage of the opportunities offered to them to study hard and to let their life shine.

Thanks to God for letting the Go and Love Foundation have an opportunity to reach out to these children in Myanmar through the internet. We hope that, through the dedicated teaching of volunteer teachers, we will not only enable the children to gain knowledge but also provide them with an opportunity to receive “the good news.”

Confronted with the tragic conditions of internal warfare, death, drugs, swindles, Covid, poverty, hunger, and a far-from-ideal education system, where can the children of Myanmar invest their hope? Nevertheless, because of love, the teachers are touching the lives of these children with their genuine hearts, and they spread the gospel to the children so they can know the God who granted them peace and understand that only Jesus Christ can save them.

At present, the courses we teach through the Internet include Bible, English, Chinese, mathematics, computer, and other courses; The Lord willing, next year, we will increase more subjects such as Biology/Health/Horticulture, Physics, Chemistry, Humanities (History/Geography/Citizens/Society/Music), Art, Accounting, and other vocational and technical courses, all of which are designed to make the high school graduates be able to enroll into an ordinary college.

Thank God! As the First John 4:19 says, “We love because He Loved us first! ■



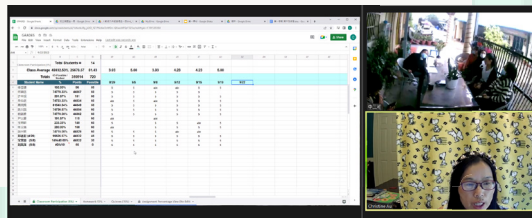
A Sweet yet **CHALLENGING TEACHING** Experience

This march, in a mission workshop held at the Chinese Bible Church of College Park, Maryland, I responded to the Go and Love Foundation President Betty Chou's calling and became an online teacher for the Holy Light Christian School in North Myanmar.

Before school started, with Teacher Jiang's help, I had a very smooth beginning. In early April, I finally met the 9th-grade students of my online class! Teacher Mingfen Yang from the Holy Light Christian School helped me set up an English WeChat group with the students so that homework assignments, as well as teaching summaries and videos, could be distributed. Students also used this medium to submit their homework. Furthermore, some students in the chat group and I became friends. We encouraged each other, shared and prayed for each other as one in the Lord's family. Through the photos and videos that the students sent me through WeChat, I was able to see their living environment and church worship activities, etc. Through the video they sent me celebrating Teacher's Appreciation Day, I could sense that the students deeply respect their teacher.

Nonetheless, online teaching for these Burmese students is also full of challenges. Although I am experienced in online teaching, the availability of teaching resources and technological advancement within the U.S., in addition to the teacher training and hardware support abundantly provided by the local school district, all made the teaching interaction and progress much smoother. For Myanmar, the situation is entirely different. I have to constantly make adjustments to my teaching strategies and methods to maintain the students' learning interests. I recall that during the first few months of school, we ran into internet issues in every class session. Fortunately, I could use the WeChat group on my cell phone to solve the problems. For example, whenever the internet fails, I would post the related teaching videos and presentation slides on WeChat and ask the students to learn through WeChat until the internet resume. Another problem was that



most students had neither computers nor cell phones, a condition that affected their learning. President Chou and Minister Chen worked tirelessly and communicated with the Holy Light Christian School's principal to resolve these issues. Nowadays, the internet's stability has dramatically improved, making teaching much smoother. Hallelujah! Praise the Lord!

Before I plan for each class, I would evaluate the student's previous participation level and homework progress to adjust accordingly. In addition, I also adjust the teaching content and activities based on the student's interests and progress. Besides learning basic grammar, I also incorporate practical day-to-day conversations to increase the student's interest in learning. Their scores in their mid-term exam showed great improvements. The students in the Holy Light Christian School attend the online class at 6 am daily. After they finish their class at 7:30 am, they would then go to their Burmese school. This kind of hard work is not something that U.S. teachers and students would tolerate. Therefore, I always praise the students for their diligence in getting up early every day to learn. It is just not easy! Most of the students lack a good foundation in English. Many are struggling with basic grammar and simple conversations. Therefore, I searched for many related English videos to strengthen their listening skills. During this process, a young man named Joe from the Chinese Bible Church of College Park partnered with me for a short period to help the students learn phonics and day-to-day conversations.

Myanmar is a very poor country. A civil war lasted for two years. Only four students are willing to continue high school. Others must work or be part of the sales force. The four children will enjoy their last learning opportunity at school before entering society. I also hope they know that their teachers only love them because of the Lord Jesus' love. President Chou says that the goal for GAL is to raise the education level in Myanmar so that many more children can receive a better education.

Looking back at my teaching journey these past months, I have built a good relationship with mutual trust and care with my 9th-grade students. It is my heavenly father's fantastic grace and guidance for me to be a volunteer online teacher today at Holy Light Christian School.

I will continue to work hard for the children, hoping to be the 10th-grade English teacher next year because there will be two students waiting for me! ■



HOPE

Dear Grandma Chou:

Greetings!

I am Yang Xiao-ying, a student sponsored by you. First of all, I would like to thank you for your help in my study through the years. Time flies, and it has been four years since I received financial assistance from the Go and Love Foundation. I was then in my third year of high school; my family's poverty had brought me a lot of financial burdens. I understood the hard times deeply that my family was going through. In addition, the medical expenses incurred by my mother's poor health made the difficult family even worse. Fortunately, you all appeared that year. It was you who brought hope to my path of education, eased the financial burden of my parents, and brought light to our family. I would like to say to you from the bottom of my heart: "Thank you."

My education journey: I took the college entrance examination in 2019. A lot of things happened that year, so I ended up being admitted to only one vocational school. When filling out the preference for the college entrance examination, I applied for the preschool education major at Baoshan University. During the busy three years of college, I gained knowledge and skills and also understood much philosophy of life. This year, I graduated from junior college and successfully entered the undergraduate program of Pu'er College in Pu'er City, Yunnan Province, continuing my major study in preschool education.

Pu'er's climate is subtropical, and the weather is very hot. The campus environment of Pu'er College is good, and there are many resources in the library for us to use, such as varieties of books, electronic reading rooms, and study rooms. The learning atmosphere here is also very good; everyone is striving; they are preparing for CET 4 or 6, teaching qualification, postgraduate entrance examination, civil servants' exam, or staff member exam. Although I have been working hard, there is still a certain amount of invisible pressure. However, I believe that since I can go from junior college to undergraduate study, I can also reach for even higher achievements.

My primary learning content includes but is not limited to dance, piano, painting, vocal music, preschool child education, preschool child psychology, and the five areas of kindergarten courses: preschool children's science education, social education, language education, health education, and art education. This list covers required courses and many other enrichment courses.

After three years of study, I have obtained the Preschool Teacher Qualification Certificate, the Intermediate Nursery Teacher Qualification Certificate, and the China Huacai Dance Level 1-3 Certificate. In addition, I plan to achieve the following academic levels in the near future: Computer Level 1 B, English Application Ability Level A (English Level 4 is in preparation), and Mandarin 2B (striving for the level 2 test).

My career plan: I am currently preparing to get the primary school teacher qualification certificate, as well as Level 4 of English and Level 2 of Mandarin. These are the goals to be achieved within two years. In addition, I plan to read more books to improve my knowledge. At the same time, I also consider studying some books on teacher preparation and public service exams to prepare for employment after graduation. Upon graduating in 2024, I will apply for a job as a kindergarten teacher or a primary school teacher, and I will also seek other suitable job opportunities. Although I feel very stressed and confused sometimes, I believe that there will be a rainbow after the storm. So, press on!

I am a relatively self-disciplined student. I have been through roughness and confusion, but I still persevered. I will not change my original goal; I will stick to what I have been pursuing. I always know that only education can change my status quo, so I keep studying vigilantly. I hope that in the future, I will be a person who has the ability to help others and fulfill my social responsibility. People should live not only for themselves but also for the community, and for others and be valuable people to society. As a young person, one should always be vigorous and positive. I have ideals. I bear burdens, take on responsibilities, always cherish dreams, and always walk on the road of endeavor!

Brother Li's Story

Brother Li was a recovered leper in his 60s. He embraced the Lord in 2003.

After he was diagnosed with leprosy, his wife could not bear the blow and ran away from home. Her whereabouts is still unknown. After his wife left, he lived alone with a 3-year-old daughter and a 5-year-old son. As a disabled man, he had to confront tremendous difficulties to support his family.

When such a situation came upon him, he felt as if the sky were falling. He considered suicide, but every time he thought about his children, he gave up the idea. He could have freed himself of the burden by ending his own life, but what about the children? They were so young and helpless. With this thought in his mind, he strived to support his family.

It was rather fortunate that he got to know our family of Christians. They preached the gospel to him, and his life was turned around. He was very thankful to God. Although he raised two children by himself, thanks to God's protection, the two children never got sick.

Once he rode a tricycle to a meeting to share his testimony. On the way, it was raining, and the tricycle slipped and overturned. His left hand was cut open and bleeding badly. He wrapped up his wound with a small piece of toilet paper and went to the meeting undeterred, for he knew that the brothers and sisters were waiting for him to share his testimony. He endured the pain and rushed to the church. Brothers and sisters tried to persuade him to see a doctor first for treatment, but he would rather wait until the sharing was over.

After this long delay, the blood flow to his left hand was compromised, and the hand looked bloodless. As soon as the doctor saw it, he told him that the hand had to be amputated. He didn't want to lose his hand because he was counting on it to make a living. While praying silently, he told the doctor to clean the wound as much as possible and then sew it up at his own risk. The doctor asked his family to sign the paper. But he could not call on anyone to sign the paper for him. As a last resort, he had to seek help from the doctor who was in charge of his case. In the end, the hospital performed an operation on his wounded hand.

A miracle happened! After a week, new flesh grew out. He told the brothers and sisters that God is omnipotent and omnipresent. As long as we trust Him, nothing will fail. He said that all that has happened to him has been through God's guidance and arrangement. Glory be to God. ■
